

LANGUAGE IN ANY WEATHER

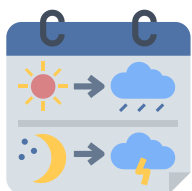


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Weather can be unpredictable, but talking about and playing in any weather is great for promoting language! Here are some creative ways you can use weather to encourage language at home!

Make it part of your routine! Incorporate talking about the weather in your daily routine. While you and your child are getting ready or even during breakfast, look outside the window together and talk about what you see and how it feels. For Example: "I see the sun!" or "I'm so cold!"



Use play sounds! Try using play sounds to describe the weather we see and feel. "drip drip drip" goes the rain, "brrr brrr brrr" when it's cold, or "shine shine shine" in the sun. Play sounds are fun and motivating to promote sound imitation.



Talk about what we need for the day! Maybe you need your hat to protect from the sun or an umbrella in the rain--this is a great way to talk about object function and sequencing when getting ready.



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
