

# ENCOURAGING LANGUAGE ON THE ROAD

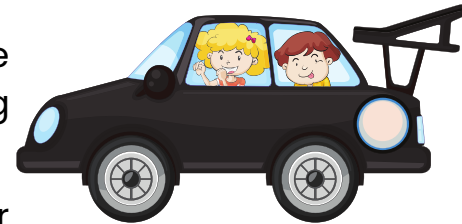

**Talk about the car!** It's always great to learn about parts of a whole object. Talk about the parts inside and outside of the car.

**Imitate noises!** Listen for the fun noises of being on the road. Imitate the beeps, the honks and sirens as they pass!



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
