LANGUAGE IN THE KITCHEN





The kitchen is often referred to as the heart of the home. Whether your cooking or just enjoying a meal with your kiddo, it is always a great opportunity to encourage speech and language development! The kitchen and meal times are such sensory and language-filled times! Here are some tips and strategies for you to use next time you're in the kitchen!



Give choices! Choices allow for independence! Even if your child is not yet talking, they can communicate with a point, reach or eye contact. Model their selection.



Describe your food! Is it crunchy? Mushy? Colorful? hot? Yummy? Let's talk about it! Using short, simple and slow language, model describing the textures, colors and shapes of your meal! Exaggerate the noises and have fun with your food!

Go through it step by step! When making a recipe or even getting your meal plated or setting up the table, talk about each step one by one. Model using sequencing vocabulary such as, "first, then, next, last".



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
